### **Support for the Iron Bridge Restoration Project**

Support from within the local community for the aims of the Iron Bridge Restoration Project have been clearly demonstrated by the collection of signatures on a petition urging the Council to take action over the bridge's restoration.

The petition is underpinned by many letters of support received from local organisations, community groups and also from individual members of the public.

Support has been conclusively demonstrated by the donation of funds from a variety of local sources and offers of help in the supply of materials and professional services during the bridge's restoration. Practical assistance has also been received from many local organisations and individuals, enabling a number of fund-raising events to be held.

This document summarises the support and funding received by the project at the time of writing, in March 2003. All correspondence and documentation listed here is available for inspection, should this be required.

#### **Petition**

❖ A petition, supported by Marple Local History Society and Marple Community Council, with over 2,000 signatures stating their support for the Marple Website's campaign to restore the Iron Bridge in Brabyns Park, and urging Stockport MBC to take action before it is too late.
